Eucharistic Prayer

The Eucharistic Prayer is the central prayer of the wedding mass, where the priest consecrates the bread and wine, invoking the Holy Spirit and giving thanks for Christ's sacrifice, which is celebrated in the gift of the Eucharist.

Celebrant: You are indeed holy, O Lord, the fount of all holiness.

Make holy, therefore, these gifts, we pray, by sending down Your Spirit upon them like the dewfall, so that they may become for us the Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ.

At the time He was betrayed and entered willingly into His Passion, He took bread and, giving thanks, broke it, and gave it to His disciples, saying:

Nuptial Blessing

The Nuptial Blessing is a special prayer during the wedding mass that invokes God's grace and protection upon the couple, blessing their union and asking for His continued guidance and love throughout their marriage.

Celebrant:

Let us pray to the Lord for this bride and groom, who come to the altar as they begin their married life,

That by partaking of the Body and Blood of Christ they may always be bound together by love for one another.

Holy Father, who formed man in Your own image, male and female You created them, so that as husband and wife, united in body and heart, they might fulfil their calling in the world;





Celebrant:

O God, who, to reveal the great design You formed in your love, willed that the love of spouses for each other should foreshadow the covenant You graciously made with Your people,

So that, by fulfilment of the sacramental sign, the mystical marriage of Christ with His Church might become manifest in the union of husband and wife among Your faithful;

Graciously stretch out Your right hand over these Your servants, Philip and Cassandra, we pray, and pour into their hearts the power of the Holy Spirit.

Agnus Dei

The Agnus Dei is a prayer sung during the wedding mass, invoking Christ as the Lamb of God and asking for His mercy and peace. It is a moment of reflection and preparation as the congregation prepares to receive the Eucharist.

The Holy Communion

The Holy Communion is the moment in the wedding mass when the couple and congregation receive the body and blood of Christ, uniting in faith and grace as they celebrate the sacredness of the marriage sacrament.

Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb.

All: Lord, I am not worthy that You should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed.



During Holy Communion, Catholics receive the body and blood of Christ, typically by approaching the altar and receiving the Eucharist from the priest. This sacred moment signifies spiritual nourishment and unity with Christ and the community.



For Non-Catholics: If you are not Catholic, you are welcome to remain seated or come forward for a blessing. You may cross your arms over your chest to indicate that you would like a blessing rather than Communion.

The Communion Hymn is a spiritual song sung during the reception of Holy Communion, enhancing the sacred atmosphere as the couple and congregation reflect on the significance of the Eucharist and their unity in faith.
